## OTTO SVERDRUP – The 'Norwegian' Explorer Unwavering leadership in the face of adversity



- The Fram: Oversaw construction of the legendary polar ship First Fram Expedition: Captain 4 years frozen in the Arctic Ocean Second Fram Expedition: Expedition Leader discovered & mapped over 150,000 km2 what is today northernmost part of Canada, 4-year expedition
- Fram Museum: personal quest to create the famous Fram Museum
  Several successful rescue missions to save other endangered expeditions.
